Homework: You will be given a homework assignment almost every day in class. You will be expected to read and study the assignment and make your best attempt to work the given exercises prior to the next class meeting. There will be concepts discussed in the reading assignment that we may not cover in class. On randomly selected days, I will collect homework at the beginning of class.

Special Assignments : There will be some projects which will be assigned and graded. These assignments are due at the beginning of class on the due date specified (and will not be accepted late. The total of all of these assignments, any in-class quizzes, and homework will count no more than 1 test grade.

Tests & Exams : There will be three 100 point tests during the semester - tentative test dates are : 9/28, 11/2, and 11/30. There will be one 50 point skills test on algebra and trigonometry – tentative date 10/1. You are expected to take each of these tests at the scheduled time. If illness or emergency make it necessary for you to miss a test, you must have your absence approved by me prior to missing the test. Any test missed without my prior approval will result in a grade of 0 for that test. Any necessary make-up tests will be scheduled individually. You will not be allowed more than one make-up test during the semester. (Please note that having 2 or more tests/papers on the same day is not considered an emergency – so please plan ahead and don't procrastinate!) There will also be a 150 point, cumulative, departmental final exam at the end of the semester. **The final exam will be given on Thursday, December 13, 9am – 12 noon.** The room for the exam will be announced at the end of the semester. All Math 111 students will take essentially the same exam at the same time, therefore, the date and time of the final exam are not negotiable. We do not make exceptions to this policy, so please plan appropriately.

Grading : Grading will be on a 10 percentage point scale with approximately 2-3 pts reserved for a (+) or a (-) grade.

Attendance: You are expected to be **present, on time and prepared** for each scheduled class meeting. All cell phones, pagers, and computers are to be turned OFF/closed during class. Excessive absences or tardies may result in a grade penalty. You are responsible for everything that we do in class even if you are not present. If you miss a class, it is your responsibility to contact a classmate to find out what we discussed and to get caught up with the class before our next class.
