ALEKS	ALEKS is a computer review of pre-calculus skills. You MUST take an initial ALEKS assessment test on Thursday 1/15, in Manchester 16 between 8 am and 8 pm. Your final ALEKS score will be the higher of your final progress assessment and your final proctored assessment provided they are within 5 points of each other. (Otherwise you will receive your final proctored assessment score.)
